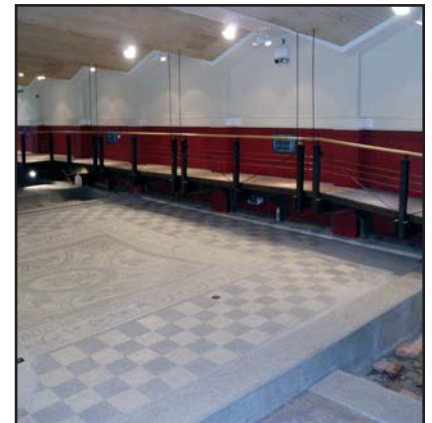

Roles & Responsibilities:

The company acted on this project as Quantity Surveyor and CDM Planning Supervisor for the construction of a collection discovery centre and the refurbishment of the existing roman palace protection building and museum.

Scheme:

The Fishbourne Roman Palace attraction is built on the actual roman palace site. There is a building which houses mosaics from the original palace and the site also consists of a museum, an audio visual theatre and foyer area. Due to the historic nature of the site, the mosaics required extensive protection and excavations carried out had to be under the watching brief of the museum archaeologist. The works to the existing museum were carried out in three phases to allow the museum to remain open to visitors. The new collection discovery centre is an extension to the museum, where visitors are able to become interactive with the archaeology of the site.
